ASSESSMENT METHODOLOGY:

Assessment is designed to measure students' knowledge, practical skills, and competency against the requirements of the qualification. A variety of assessment methods may be used throughout the course, including:

Assessment activities are conducted in accordance with the requirements of the relevant training package and applicable unit(s) of competency.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

- There are no formal prerequisite units for entry into this qualification. However, applicants must satisfy CCM s admission requirements before enrolment.
- International applicants are required to demonstrate an appropriate level of English language proficiency through one of the following:

- IELTS Academic overall score of 6.0; or
- PTE Academic overall score of 52; o
- An equivalent English language test accepted by CCM

Alternative evidence of English language proficiency may also be considered in accordance with CCM s Admissions and Student Selection Policy. Where formal evidence is unavailable, applicants may be required to complete an English Placement Test.

Note: In the absence of formal English qualifications, College of Construction and Management may prefer an English Placement Test

Academic Requirement

Applicants are expected to have successfully completed an Australian Year 12 qualification or an overseas qualification recognised as equivalent.

Age Requirement

All applicants must be aged 18 years or over at the time of applying for admission to the course.

Language Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) Requirement

All students are required to complete a Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) assessment prior to commencing their studies. This assessment assists CCM in identifying any additional learning support that may be required and ensures students are appropriately prepared for the course.

Technology Requirements

Students should possess basic digital literacy skills, including the ability to use common computer applications such as Microsoft Word, Excel, and PowerPoint. Students are also required to have access to a personal computer that meets the minimum technical specifications recommended by CCM to effectively participate in learning and assessment activities.
